

After EAP courses, what next? Students' independent use of corpora

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Definitions

- Independent use refers to students' use of their DIY corpus on their own after the end of the corpus course
- Do-it-yourself (DIY) corpora are corpora built individually by students using research articles in their own field



Phases of the Research

- 1. Introduction of corpus work on Academic Writing Course for international graduates
- 2. Administration of on-line questionnaire 12 months later
- 3. Data aggregated for 5 years 2009 2013



Corpus Course

- 1 weekly 2-hour session
- Course duration of 6 weeks
- 5-7 parallel multidisciplinary classes
- 10-16 students in each class
- Open access and not assessed
- Taught by 3 tutors



Aims of the Corpus Course

- Explore disciplinary discourse
- Individualise academic writing instruction
- Foster student autonomy
- Provide a resource for future independent use (Charles 2012, 2014)



Corpus Course Programme

1.	Problem-solving with hands-on concordancing	Preposition patterns, collocation	Concordancing
2.	Building your corpus and referring to the literature	Citation patterns	Corpus- Building
3.	Investigating self-reference	First person forms (I, we)	Clusters
4.	Making and countering arguments	Linking adverbs	Word List
5.	Making and modifying claims	Reporting verbs, adjectives, adverbs	Collocates
6.	Defending your research against criticism	Subordination and Co-ordination	Context Searching



Students' Corpus Experience

- Students built corpora from research articles in their own fields (Charles 2012; Lee & Swales 2006)
- Software: AntConc (e.g. Anthony 2014)
- Tools: Concordancer, Word List, Collocates, Clusters
- Students retrieved, interpreted and discussed their corpus data (Charles 2007, 2012)



Research Questions

- To what extent do learners use their DIY corpus independently after the course?
- What is the main purpose of independent use?
- What are students' attitudes to DIY corpusbuilding and use?



Data for this Study

- On-line survey
- Questions on corpus use, purpose, future intentions, attitudes etc.
- Sent 12 months after completion of the course
- 134 replies



Participants

Degree	Level	Field
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
Doctoral 60% Natural Science 55%

Other 10% Humanities 15%




Have you used your DIY corpus at any time since the course ended? (n = 134)






Non-Users: Do you intend to use your DIY corpus in the future? (n = 39)

Frequent and Infrequent Users

Frequent users: 1 per week or more


51 (57%)

Infrequent users: 1 per month or less

39 (43%)




Has the use of your DIY corpus helped to improve your academic writing? (n = 90)





Improvement in Writing: Frequent and Infrequent Users






Improvement in Writing: Frequent and Infrequent Users

- Significant difference between frequent and infrequent users ($\chi^2 = 14.3$, p = 0.003)
- Frequent users are more confident that corpus use improved their writing




What was the main purpose of your DIY corpus use? (n = 87)





Purpose of Corpus Use: Frequent and Infrequent Users






Purpose of Corpus Use: Frequent and Infrequent Users

- No significant difference between frequent and infrequent users ($\chi^2 = 3.29$, p = 0.193)
- Frequent and infrequent users have similar purposes of corpus use




Would you recommend other international students to build a DIY corpus? (n = 130)





Recommend Corpus-Building: Users and Non-Users (n = 130)





Recommend Corpus-Building: Users and Non-Users

- Significant difference between users and nonusers ($\chi^2 = 16.2$, p = 0.003)
- Users are more likely to recommend corpus building



To Sum Up: One Year On

Most learners

- use their DIY corpus independently (68%)
- would recommend DIY corpus building (86%)

Most independent users

consult their DIY corpus frequently (57%)

Frequent users

are more confident about their improvement in writing



Implications: Issues, Challenges and Solutions

- Students have long-term and short-term needs
- Corpus competence serves both
- DIY corpora are free, quick to build, easy to consult
- They offer an individualised resource for independent learning
